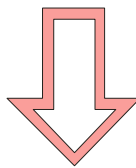

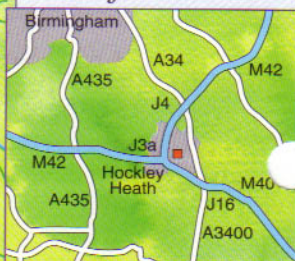


The perfect location

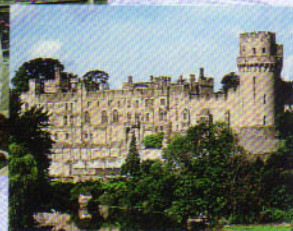
